

Household phone agreement (example)

An educational example of an agreement a household writes together. Boundaries everyone chose beat rules one person imposed, and nobody needs surveillance to keep a promise.

HOW TO USE THIS EXAMPLE

1. Read it together. Everyone, including adults, gets to push back on any line.
2. Cross out what doesn't fit and write your own versions. The editing is the point.
3. Agree on it out loud, then post it somewhere visible. Revisit it in two weeks.

OUR AGREEMENT (EXAMPLE WORDING)

- Phones live in the charging spot, not in bedrooms, from ____ pm on school and work nights.
- Meals are phone-free for everyone at the table, adults included.
- Nobody checks anyone else's phone. We keep promises, we don't monitor each other.
- The first 30 minutes after waking are feed-free. Alarms, music, and messages are fine.
- When someone slips, we say so and move on. No scorekeeping, no shaming.
- Calls and anything urgent always go through. This is about feeds, not reachability.
